

RELINQUISHMENT OF RIGHT OF WAY IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY

ROAD VII - LA - 4 - A,B,C,D

WHEREAS, the State of California heretofore acquired a right of way for State highway purposes in Los Angeles County on Sections A, B, C and D of State highway Route 4, in T. 5 N., R. 17 W., in T. 6 N., R. 17 W., in T. 7 N., R. 17 and 18 W., and in T. 8 N., R. 17 and 18 W., S. B. B. & M., and

WHEREAS, a portion of said right of way is no longer used for State highway purposes and the California Highway Commission deems the relinquishment of said portion is necessary by reason of alteration and revision in alignment of a portion of the route of said State highway, and deems it for the best interests of the State of California,

IT IS VOTED, That the State of California, acting by and through the California Highway Commission, does hereby relinquish to the County of Los Angeles that portion of said State highway right of way from Castaic Postoffice to junction of Routes 4 and 59 near General Petroleum Station north of Sandbergs, via National Forest Inn and Liebre, known as the Ridge Route, which lies in said townships and northerly of the northeasterly line of the 100 foot strip of right of way as described in deed recorded in Book 9611, page 281 of Official Records and southerly of the southerly line of the 100 foot strip of right of way described as Parcel No. 1 in deed recorded in Book 10610, page 116 of Official Records; all records of Los Angeles County.

The purpose of this resolution is to revert to the County of Los Angeles, as a county road and highway, the title to said portion of road or highway hereby relinquished.

THIS IS TO CERTIFY That the foregoing is a full and correct copy of the original resolution passed by the California Highway Commission at its meeting regularly called and held on the 3rd day of August 1934, in the City of Sacramento, a majority of the members of said Commission being present and voting therefor, and that the same has never been rescinded, and is now in full force and effect.
